### <u>Item VII: Consider Adoption of Resolution No. 04-18-011 Designating Check Signers for PBWA Bank Account</u>

♦ The Commission was asked to consider adoption of Resolution No. 04-18-011, designating check signers for the Puente Basin Water Agency's Bank of America Merrill Lynch account and to adopt the Bank of America Merrill Lynch Banking Resolution and Certificate of Incumbency.

#### Item VIII: Discussion and Approval of the Proposed Annual PBWA Budget for FY 2018-19

- Mr. Teuber presented the proposed PBWA Fiscal Year 2018-19 Budget. He highlighted various elements of the budget and noted some increases in expenses projected over last year's budget.
- Staff then requested that the Commission consider approval of the Proposed FY 2018-19 Budget and indicated that the budget would be presented to the Member Agencies' Boards of Directors for approval as well.

Upon consideration thereof, it was moved by Commissioner Ebenkamp, seconded by Commissioner Lewis and unanimously carried (3-0), to approve the PBWA Budget for Fiscal Year 2018-19, and to present that proposed Budget to the Rowland Water District and Walnut Valley Water District Boards for approval.

#### Chair Lima indicated that the motion was approved by a 3-0 vote

#### **Item IX: Consider Contract for Auditing Services**

Mr. Teuber informed the Commission of the pending expiration of the auditing services contract and asked the Commissioners to review and approve the engagement of Davis Farr LLP for auditing services for an additional two-year term commencing with fiscal year 2018.

Upon consideration thereof, it was moved by Commissioner Ebenkamp, seconded by Commissioner Lewis and unanimously carried (3-0), to approve the engagement of Davis Farr LLP, for auditing services for an additional two-year term commencing with fiscal year 2018.

#### Item X: Regional Water Supply Reliability Program Updates/Status:

- (1) California Domestic Water Company:
  - a. Project Update: Mr. Coleman reported that the Cal Domestic project is continuing to produce water.
- (2) Pathfinder.
  - a. Pathfinder Road 20-inch Water Main Installation (P.N. PB17-0004) Adoption of Notice of Exemption:
    - Mr. Hitchman reported that the Pathfinder Road 20-inch Water Main Installation project requires a Notice of Exemption from CEQA. The Commissioners were asked to authorize staff to file a Notice of Exemption for the project.

Upon consideration thereof, it was moved by Commissioner Ebenkamp seconded by Commissioner Lewis, and unanimously carried (3-0), to authorize staff to file a Notice of Exemption from CEQA for the 20" Water Transmission Main project (P.N. PB17-0004).

#### Chair Lima indicated that the motion was approved by a 3-0 vote

- b. Project Update: Mr. Hitchman reported the project is tentatively scheduled to begin in late June.
- (3) Pomona Basin Regional Groundwater Project
  - a. *Project Update:* Mr. Hitchman stated that staff have reviewed and provided comments on the draft design for the project. The consultant will return the final plans soon. Sending this item out for bid is the next step for the project.
  - b. Update: Proposition 84: Mr. Hitchman stated that staff has met with County staff regarding the possibility of an extension for the Agency's grant application. Along with Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District and West Basin Municipal Water District, we have packaged a request for an extension through December 2019. Final extension approval will be by the Department of Water Resources.

#### (4) Central Basin Well

- a. *Project Update:* Mr. Coleman stated that the Hydrogeologist the Agency has engaged is in the process of completing a draft report and it will be submitted to staff upon completion.
- (5) Proposition 1 Integrated Regional Water Management Grant:
  - a. *Project Update:* Mr. Holmes reported that staff is continuing to work with LASER, Inc., on potential projects for which grant funding may be sought. He also stated that the draft guidelines for that grant funding have not been released for review.
  - b. LA Solutions for Engineering Solutions, LLC (LASER): Third Addendum to Professional Services Agreement for Strategic Consulting Services: Mr. Hitchman requested that the Commissioners authorize the Administrative Officer to execute a Third Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement for strategic consulting services for LA Solutions for Engineering Resources (LASER), LLC, with an increase of funding in the amount of \$60,000, extending the contract to June 30, 2019. Legal counsel was requested to prepare the Third Amendment.

Upon consideration thereof, it was moved by Commissioner Ebenkamp seconded by Commissioner Lewis, and unanimously carried (3-0), to authorize the Administrative Officer to execute a Third Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement for strategic consulting services for LA Solutions for Engineering Resources (LASER), LLC, to be prepared by Legal counsel to cover an increase of funding of \$60,000 and an extension of the agreement's term to June 30, 2019.

Pursuant to the Judgment in <u>Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District v. City of Alhambra, et al.</u> and its Exhibit J, Puente Narrows Agreement, the subsurface flow passing from Puente Basin to the Main San Gabriel Basin was determined for fiscal year 2017-18. This determination of subsurface flow was made in accordance with Appendix C, Engineering Criteria, to Exhibit J of the Judgment and consisted of measuring the water levels at the two key wells.

The field measurements of the water levels at the upstream well, 2S/10W-9Q, and downstream well, 2S/10W-8E3, for Fall 2017 were collected on October 5, 2017 by Mr. Tuan Nguyen of Stetson Engineers Inc. representing Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District and Mr. Charlie Devine of Civiltec Engineering Inc. representing Puente Basin Water Agency. The field measurements of the water levels at the upstream well, 2S/10W-9Q, and downstream well, 2S/10W-8E3, for Spring 2018 were collected on April 5, 2018 by Mr. Tuan Nguyen of Stetson Engineers Inc. representing Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District and Mr. Charlie Devine of Civiltec Engineering Inc. representing Puente Basin Water Agency. Based on the Fall 2017 and Spring 2018 static water levels at the key wells, the subsurface flow was determined to be 995 acre-feet for fiscal year 2017-18, as shown on Table 1.

Field inspections of the concrete-lined San Jose Creek channel were made concurrently with the field water level measurements and indicated no apparent withdrawal of flow in the San Jose Creek channel from the boundary of Spadra Basin with Puente Basin and downstream to Puente Narrows.

The Puente Narrows Agreement requires that a perpetual accounting of the subsurface flow through Puente Narrows be maintained. Presented in Table 2 is the accounting to date, showing the Accumulated Base Underflow (at 580 acre-feet per year in accordance with Paragraph 8 of the Agreement), the Annual and Accumulated Subsurface Flow to date under the Agreement, the Accumulated Credit or Debit of Puente Agency and the Adjusted Accumulated Credit or Debit of Puente Agency (from Table 3).

By Agreement dated November 30, 1989, Puente Basin Water Agency and Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District agreed that groundwater extracted from Puente Basin that is treated and discharged to the lined channel, and then percolated in the Main Basin as part of Carrier Corporation's cleanup program, which is required by the Regional Water Quality Control Board, shall be credited to

Puente Agency as subsurface outflow from Puente Basin. Evaporation losses and unusable surface outflow to the ocean are deducted from such groundwater extraction from Puente Basin. As shown on Table 3, Column 6, since fiscal-year 2007-08, Carrier stopped discharging this treated water and the water is being beneficially used in the Puente Basin.

Table 3 shows the Groundwater Extraction for Cleanup Purposes, Deliveries to Rowland Water District, Discharge to Sanitary Sewer, Total Evaporation Losses, Unusable Outflow to Ocean, Annual Cleanup Extraction Credit, accumulated Annual Cleanup Extraction Credit, Accumulated Credit or Debit of Puente Agency (from Table 2), and the Adjusted Accumulated Credit or Debit of Puente Agency.

RE: Award of Contract for the Six Basins Groundwater Project – Phase 1B (P.N. PB18-0005)

#### **Recommendation**

That the Commission authorize the Administrative Officer to execute a contract for the Six Basins Groundwater Project – Phase 1B (P.N. PB18-0005) to Robert Brkich Construction Corp in the amount of \$4,054,581.00.

#### **Background**

As you know, the PBWA has been working for several years on the Six Basins Groundwater Project, also known as the Pomona Basin Regional Groundwater Project. The purpose of this project is utilize the Old Baldy Well and a replacement Durward Well to which produce groundwater from the Six Basins, both the Live Oak and Pomona Basin.

The Phase 1A project, which involved the installation of two isolation valves and by-pass lines on the Pomona-Walnut-Rowland (PWR) Joint Water Line (JWL), was completed May 2015. The Phase 1B project involves the following facilities: (i) approximately 4,000 feet of twelve-inch through twenty-inch diameter pipeline, running from the Old Baldy Well Site, at the intersection of 5<sup>th</sup> and C streets in La Verne, to a point of connection with the JWL at Fairplex Drive adjacent to Golden State Water Company's (GSWC) Durward Well Site, north of Wright Avenue; (ii) a sixteen-inch bypass structure, with a 16 inch flow control valve, located upstream of the Three Valleys Municipal Water District (TVMWD) Miramar connection to the JWL; (iii) a forty-two inch bypass structure, with a 36 inch flow control and 18 inch flow control valves and meter, located at the GSWC Durward Well Site (iv) a twelve-inch connection to the JWL for GSWC at the Durward Well Site; (v) Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system components at each facility.

Based on the results of the bid opening and following a review of the bid documents, staff recommends award of the Phase 1B construction contract to Robert Brkich Construction Corp in the amount of \$4,054,581.00. The engineers' estimate for the Phase 1B project was \$4,182,000. Attached for your information is the bid recap, and schematic for the project.

The Notice of Exemption (NOE) for the project was filed with the Los Angeles County Registrar/County Clerk on February 23, 2016.

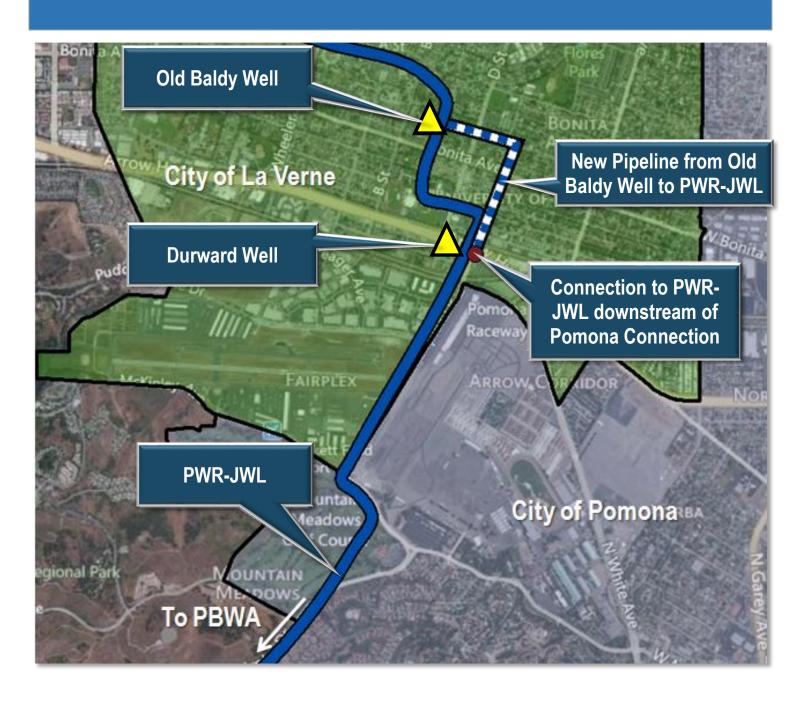

#### **Recommendation**

That the Commission authorize the Administrative Officer to purchase two CLA Val control valves from Western Waterworks Supply Company at the price shown below.

36-inch Control Valve \$114,804.14 18-inch Control Valve \$41,220.73 Total \$156,024.87

#### **Background**

The Pomona Basin Regional Groundwater Project, requires three CLA Val Control Valves to be installed at the two flow control structures to be built near the intersection of 5<sup>th</sup> and "C" Streets in La Verne and at Golden State Water Company's Durward Well Site.

In order to procure these valves, staff contacted CLA Val Co. to get a price for the 36-ich and 18-inch valves, the prices for direct purchase of the valves form CLA Val Co. came back at \$152,350 and \$54,700 respectively for a total cost of \$207,050. Although we could purchase directly from CLA Val Co. they indicated that their preference was to use one of their local distributors. Western Waterworks Supply Company was one of their distributors and is also a distributor that Walnut Valley Water District has on our approved supplier list. Staff solicited quotes from Western Waterworks Supply Company and received proposals for both valves of \$114,804.14 for the 36-inch valve and \$41,220.73 for the 18-inch valve.

The 5<sup>th</sup> and "C" vault requires a 16-inch flow control valve. The 16-inch valve was originally purchased as part of the Cal Domestic Project but was not used in the redesigned pressure reducing building and was planned for use in this project instead.

Based on the significant cost savings associated with purchasing the valves from Western Waterworks Supply Company instead of directly from CLA Val Co., staff recommends that the two control valves be purchased from Western Waterworks Supply Company.
